VAN Office Consultation

Over the break I received a call from the DVA informing me that a period of consultation regarding the future model of service delivery by the Geelong VAN Office had been initiated.

The Geelong & district region had a month to consult ESOs and others about the most efficient service delivery by DVA.

After broad consultation with the region's stakeholders the conclusion was fairly obvious ... we don't want the Geelong VAN office to close and move into the Centrelink complex.

Experience from other regions where this happened suggests that the service delivery is much inferior and unreliable. A submission has been prepared, with a number of responses from the Geelong RSL, Geelong Surf Coast Veterans Centre, the TPI Association and Legacy, and many individual responses. These I have written to the Geelong Council CEO Dr. Gillian Miles, documents have been forwarded to the Acting Secretary at the DVA, Canberra. I also provided copies to Jeff Jackson RSL MP Lara and State Minister for Veteran Affairs, Christine Couzens MP Geelong and the new CoGG Veteran Affairs portfolio holder, Stretch Kontelj.

We will have to wait for Minister Ronaldson's decision.

Memorial and Avenue Project Moving Forward

Chairman of the Avenue of Honour and Memorial Sub-committee, Ken Baker, says the project is moving forward.

Committee members are: Frank Cunningham, Nigel Wilson, Colin Walters and Les Fuller. Our President Rieny, has also participated in a ex-officio capacity and has been actively involved in all aspects of the project.

Following the special evening for gleaning ideas from the general membership, the sub-committee has developed a three stage plan for the significant enhancement of our existing avenue and Memorial.

Stage I - Avenue of Honour

- Replacement of drought affected trees
- ♦ New Avenue signs
- Removal of the COGG Community Billboard

Stage 2 – Creation of a Memorial Park around the existing Memorial

- ♦ Construction of a pathway from the Osborne Park Gates to Swinburne Street
- ♦ Commemorative pavers to line the pathway
- Construct crossover form Melbourne road kerb to Osborne Park Gates
- Provide garden beds to beautify the Osborn
 Park Gates each side of the crossover
- Place a Commemorative "Roll of Honour" Panel within the park
- Place bollards and or trees to identify Memorial Park extremity

Stage 3 – Interpretative panels along the northern side of Swinburne St to Osborne Park

Preparation of panels for telling the story of Vietnam from:

- Australian Army, Navy and Air Force actions in Vietnam.
- Civil Aid programs such as Medical services to the Vietnamese

- ♦ Significant battles such as "Long Tan" and others
- AATTV and Army Nurses

The placement of a significant Vietnam icon (ie Long Tan Cross) or similar in the grounds of Osborne House near to the Lone Pine tree (WWI) and Kokoda Memorial (WW2)

Stage I is complete with exception of the removal of the COGG Community Billboard which is still under consideration and is being actively perused with Council.

We have set the end of 2015 for the completion of Stage 2 and to date we have had encouraging signs from Council staff who are drawing plans for the establishment of the park. Once received, they will be displayed.

We have begun the sale of commemorative pavers and seek your support in this. See Page 8. These pavers will show relevant Vietnam Veteran service details. They will be laid along the pathway.

Within the Memorial Park is to be a Hooped panel which acknowledges the 521 sacrifices that were made in Vietnam. Lighting of the panel will further enhance this Roll of Honour.


Detailed plans are on display at the Geelong Vietnam Veteran Centre in Osborne House. Please take time to peruse them.

Stage 3 timeline is for completion by 16 August 2016, in time for the 50 anniversary of "Battle of Long Tan".

Graeme (Ferret) Unmack has taken up the task of seeking information for the panels proposed in Stage 3. Ferret may ask you for details of various battles etc. and the sub-committee appreciates any help that you may be able to provide him with.

A decision will need to be made very soon on what the icon in Osborne House grounds will be. Suggestions welcome. (To page 7)

RSL asked to Recognise Veterans

VVAA Victorian Branch President Bob Elworthy has written to RSL Victorian Branch President David McLachlan asking to have recognition of Veteran or Service member status on RSL membership cards. His letter follows:

"Dear David

One theme that has been repeated to me whilst doing the rounds of VVAA Sub-Branches and during our quarterly State Council meetings has been the lack of visibility of the status of veterans and service personnel on the current RSL membership cards. I discussed this informally to Dr Webster last year.

As you would be aware the current membership card for all forms of RSL membership are very similar, and one has to look carefully at the bottom left hand corner to ascertain the status of the card holder. It is the view of the membership of the Victorian Branch of the VVAA that RSL membership cards issued to veterans and service members should carry a clearly distinguishable mark to identify the status of the holder. Our preferred option is for the card to bear the three service colours, in clearly visible vertical bands in the centre of the card, with the status "service" more prominently displayed.

It is the opinion of the members that re-branding veteran and service member cards will have a significant impact on these particular members who will feel more valued for their service. A rebranded card will clearly distinguish veterans and service members from the other levels of RSL membership that do not require ADF service as a prerequisite to join the RSL, and when displayed to RSL staff and others, the card will assist in reflecting positively on what the Returned and Services League of Australia is really all about. Who knows, a rebranding of the cards, and thus an acknowledgement and appreciation of their unique status, might encourage other veterans and service members to join their local RSL. "

RAAF Sub-branch Seeks Correct Vietnam Conflict End Date on Australia's Memorials

The VVAA RAAF Sub-branch is concerned at the historical inaccuracy of dates displayed on many Memorials commemorating Australia's involvement in the Vietnam war.

The Australian Vietnam Forces National memorial in Canberra carries an incorrect date according to the Sub-branch.

In a submission to the State Council Meeting at Albury on 28 February 2015, the Sub-branch recommended that 'a further approach be made to the National Council seeking their support, with National to formally request a review of the matter with the Director of Estate Management, National Capital Authority, Canberra.'

The Sub-branch also suggested an approach be made to the Victorian Veterans' Council and RSL, Victoria, advising of the date anomaly and seeking their assistance to rectify the concern.

When a cease-fire settlement was finalised in 1973 in Paris, the Australian then formally determined our involvement in the Vietnam war was from 1962 to 1973.

The RAAF Sub-branch argues that following skirmishes/incursions during 1974 by communist forces and major cease-fire breaches in 1975 the RAAF again became involved in Vietnam.

RAAF Detachment S provided relief/humanitarian flying Red Cross supplies and assisting the airlift of refugees and orphans in South Vietnam and out of the country.

Detachment S continued its mission until the fall of Saigon on 30 April 1975. It then evacuated Australian Embassy Staff and RAAF Airfield Defence Guards from Vietnam.

The Australian Government then formally amended the Vietnam conflict end date to include the RAAF 1975 Vietnam service.

Hopefully, in the near future all Australian memorials will carry the official Vietnam conflict date as 1975.

VVAA National Responds to Family Study Report 2014

The Vietnam Veterans Association of Australia has responded to the Vietnam Veterans Family Study Report 2014.

The study, in the opinion of the V.V.A.A., confirms V.V.A.A. opinion that a series of mental health conditions and their sometimes fatal outcomes are related to the military service of Vietnam veterans.

In his response, National President Ken Foster commented upon each of the four volumes of the study.

In his conclusion to the report, the National President pointed out that there were serious concerns within the V.V.A.A. that medical conditions experienced by the children and grandchildren of Vietnam veterans are linked to the chemical exposure of the veteran and that this has not, to date, been fully investigated,

It was noted that there appears to be little or no regarding any multi-generational effects on family health matters.

A number of cases continue to be investigated in an attempt to confirm the suggested link and it is important to note that no alternative explanation has been given that refutes the suggestion that a chemical exposure is involved.

The V.V.A.A. are constantly made aware of concerns from Vietnam veterans and their families that unex-

plained medical conditions may be related to the veterans exposure to chemicals and the multi-generational effect of this chemical exposure.

The V.V.A.A. do not believe the examination of this possible relationship has been fully investigated and as a minimum that where questions are asked an alternative explanation is given.

We thank the government and in particular members of the Scientific Advisory Group and the Study Consultative Forum for the time and effort expended on this study and will take this opportunity to make recommendations we feel necessary.

Recommendations:

- That the government extend the availability of mental health services and treatment to the descendants of Vietnam veterans and that no age limit is imposed on the provision of services.
- That the government develop a compensation program to financially support the descendants of Vietnam veterans where it can be shown a link exist between the child and the veteran's military service
- 3. That the government further and fully investigate the link between the exposure to chemicals and herbicides by Vietnam veterans and their descendants.

The Right Dose

Taking the right medicines at the right time is important. Taking medicines at the wrong time or in the wrong combination may make you sick—or worse.

The Department of Veterans' Affairs subsidises a Dose Administration Aid (DAA) Service to all eligible DVA card holders.

DAAs organise your medicines to help you take the right pills at the right time. They have special compartments that hold each of your solid medicines (tablets and capsules) labelled to show you the day, and when in the day, you should take them.

Your DAA is packed for you by your Pharmacist. They will be able to answer any questions that you might have about it. Your GP and pharmacist as a team monitor your use of the DAA. Used correctly, a DAA Service is a good strategy

to make sure you get the most out of your medicines.

If you take a lot of medicines, or find it difficult to manage your medicines, a DAA may help. The DAA Service is useful if you often forget to take your medicines, are confused by your medicines or require assistance to manage at home. If you are in a hospital or residential care facility, you are not eligible to receive the DAA Service.

If you think a DAA Service will help you manage your medications, then see your GP. If your GP thinks you will benefit, they can give you a DAA prescription for six months.

It costs nothing for the service, however you will need to pay for your medicines as normal. The DAA Service will not affect or count toward the safety net. Your entitlements will not be affected if you receive the DAA Service.


That would be our entire membership in less than a week. Scary stuff!!

Changes to Rehab Appliances Program

If you are a <u>Gold</u> or <u>White Card</u> holder (with assessed need due to an accepted disability), you can access aids or appliances to help you maintain independence in your home through the <u>Rehabilitation Appliances Program (RAP)</u>

Aids or appliances prescribed through the programme can include continence products, mobility and functional support aids, Personal Response Systems, Home medical oxygen, diabetic supplies, Continuous Positive Airways Pressure (CPAP) supplies.

RAP appliances are available based on an assessed clinical need made by a health provider such as a general practitioner, occupational therapist, physiotherapist, speech pathologist (speech therapist).

Your Local Medical Officer (GP) can provide the <u>necessary referral</u> to an appropriate allied health professional who can assess your need for RAP aids and appliances. Your GP can also offer advice and make requests in writing to DVA. Changes to the Rehabilitation Appliance Program (RAP) have seen the inclusion of several falls prevention items in the National Schedule of Equipment (the Schedule).

The RAP Schedule was enhanced to include a range of the falls prevention items which were supplied through the HomeFront programme. At the same time, the provision of items and services through HomeFront and the Veterans Home Maintenance Line (VHML) ceased from 6 February 2015.

These changes eliminated unnecessary duplication of assessments between the RAP and the Home Front programme. The inclusion of these falls prevention items in the RAP Schedule reduces 'red tape' and will result in an easier assessment process for eligible veterans as only one assessment will now be required.

The RAP assists eligible members of the veteran community to be independent and self-reliant in their own homes through the provision of a wide range of clinically required aids and appliances which are available on the Schedule.

Eligible veterans can continue to access the falls prevention items in the same way they access other items on the RAP Schedule by asking their GP for an assessment. If the falls prevention item is clinically required, the item will be supplied to them.
